State-Level Report for Colleges and Universities

Introduction

The Higher Education Department conducted two rounds of student and faculty satisfaction surveys in 137 colleges and 10 universities through the World Bank funded OHEPEE project in 2019 and 2022. A sample of at least 5% of the students and 60% of the faculty from the Colleges and Universities under OHEPEE responded to the survey. The objective of this activity is to identify self-perceived satisfaction levels of students and faculty members, and to use the findings for better management by the College and University authorities.

This report highlights the key findings of the two satisfaction surveys — Undergraduate / Postgraduate students and College / University faculties - conducted in 137 colleges and 10 universities under OHEPEE. It also gives a comparative scenario of satisfaction levels of the students and faculties in the two rounds of surveys conducted in 2019 and 2022.

Survey Details

Among the various dimensions taken in the student survey, satisfaction levels in the following domains are analyzed and rated.

- 1) Infrastructure
- 2) Teaching and Learning (general and SC/ST/OBC)
- 3) Student Support

Similarly, in the faculty survey, satisfaction levels are rated in the following domains:

- 1) Infrastructure 2) General Administration
- 3) Pedagogy 4) Workplace Environment
- 5) Workload 6) Governance.

The domains are rated by the respondents on a scale of 1 to 5 against

'Terrible or Very Poor', 'Unsatisfactory', 'Neutral', 'Satisfactory' and 'Excellent'.

with 1 corresponding to 'Terrible or Very Poor' and 5 corresponding to 'Excellent'.








State Average of Faculty Satisfaction Scores in Colleges











Improvement in student satisfaction levels was seen in 4 out of the 4 areas measured.
